It requires special skills and knowledge and CDL holders are held to a higher standard when operating any type of motor vehicle on public roads. This course provides the knowledge and skills to drive commercial vehicles. The course is designed to prepare an individual to enter into the job market as a professional truck driver; an industry in need of qualified workers.

In collaboration with the Local 49 group, participants will also get to learn about Heavy Highway Construction, giving them an opportunity to enter the job market with enhanced training and experience.

CDL training will consist of:
